No Longer Strangers...

This Lenten season the Wednesday Bible study is reading Fr. Richard Rohr's *Things Hidden: Scripture as Spirituality*. Through guided readings and spiritual practices, Rohr invites the reader to reclaim reading Scripture as a spiritual practice that opens a door for transforming our lives. Such an approach is in opposition to the way many read Scripture, as a means of gathering information.

As we continue our Lenten "Wandering Heart" journey, following Peter to "figure out faith," a recent reading in Rohr jumped out at me as I worked to read with Peter's eyes. From the moment we meet Peter—at his call when told to seek fish in a spot he "knows" is without hope—through each successive encounter, his early utterance to Jesus, "I'm not worthy" seems to drive his every action. At times, like his confession, he disproves his theory. At other times—his denial—he seems to prove it.

This came to mind when I read in Rohr: "God's main problem is how to give away God! But God has great difficulty doing this. You'd think everybody would want God, but the common response is something like this: "Lord, I am not worthy. I would rather have religion and morality, which give me the impression that I can win a cosmic contest by my own efforts."

Rohr's antidote is to point to Mary as the epitome of receiving God's total grace and gift. When visited by Gabriel, she does not protest her "unworthiness." She does not even ask "why?" She only asks for clarification, "How?" She knows how to say "yes" to an utterly free gift. In such a light, in response to Peter, and each of us who proclaim, "Lord, I'm not worthy," we may hear an echo from the Gospel, 'Of course, you are not, but that was never the question, anyway!"

As we wander with Peter this Lent, may we find the pathways that encourage us forward in faith, recognizing that God's love is unmerited, unabashed, and unquestionably for each of us.

Revelation: Following the Lamb



In this book of pastoral reflections N.T. Wright explores how the Lord's Prayer sums up what Jesus was all about in his first-century setting. Wright locates the Lord's Prayer, clause by clause, within the historical life and work of Jesus and allows the prayer's devotional application to grow out of its historical

context. The result is a fresh understanding of Christian spirituality and the life of prayer. This deeply devotional book will refresh and stimulate the heart and mind of any reader. Led by Charlotte Elia, this study starts at 11:15 am on Sunday, April 14, 2024 in The Pastors' Gallery on the second floor and meets on April 14, 21, 28 and May 12, 19, 26. The session has added two new exciting ways to receive CPC contributions and fee payments. In addition to traditional checks, cash and on-line contributions, going forward both a QR code and NFC tags will be available for instant, contactless, secure transmission of financial contributions to CPC.

Both QR codes and NFC tags allow a user to access the CPC web (Breeze) address/donation platform, as well other CPC information without inputting data directly into their mobile device. While a QR code is scanned with a user's camera, using an NFC tag can be simply tapped with a user's phone. Watch for the QR code in the bulletin, as well as special offering receptacles around the narthex with an NFC tag, to make your next contribution.

Garden on the Corner News

Spring is just around the corner and the Garden on the Corner Committee is already at work. Mushroom compost will be added to the entire garden. Plans are underway for Scouts to shovel mulch into the raised beds prior to **March 23 – our targeted early planting date!** Watch for specific details closer to that date.

As a result of those who have brought compost over the last 2 years, some of the resulting rich soil was added to the garden. We welcome again those who would like to resume composting to deposit the compost in the bin marked COMPOST at lower end of the garden. Please adhere to the guidelines and bring **ONLY** acceptable materials:



Fruit and vegetable peels and stalks (except citrus)

Wood ashes (full of potash) but not coal or charcoal

Dry dog food

Coffee grounds and coffee filters

Shredded paper

Peat moss

Dry grass clippings (fresh ones get smelly)

Shredded dry leaves (run the low mower over them to shred)

Chicken or turkey feathers

Pine needles

Annual flowers that you pull up after frost

Not sure if a particular item is acceptable? When it doubt, leave it out!
