Wear comfortable clothes and bring a mat and a pillow for this time of guided contemplation and centering prayer for spiritual rest and renewal.

Thursday Spirituality Workshops

Join Director of Christian Formation Charlotte Elia Thursdays from 10:30am-12pm in the first floor conference room for workshops designed to enhance your creativity and refresh your spirit.

Journaling as Prayer: April 11

In this workshop you'll draw inspiration from a classic Christian spirituality excerpt and a brief centering prayer before being encouraged to pour out your hidden heart to God through the written word. This experience should leave you feeling more self-aware, spiritually present, and connected to God. Bring your favorite writing tools, e.g. journal, paper, pen, laptop, etc.

Psalms of Lament: April 18

In this workshop you'll be introduced to the form and structure of the biblical psalms of lament before being encouraged to use that model to express your own sorrows or frustrations in prayer to God. This creative exercise is designed as a tool to deepen your connection with God. Bring your favorite writing tools, e.g. journal, paper, pen, laptop, etc.

Lectio Divina: April 25

In this workshop you'll engage the ancient practice of Lectio Divina or "sacred reading" in which you'll be invited to meditate on a brief portion of scripture through repeated hearings of the text. You'll then be invited to respond to the text using the medium of your choosing including journaling, poetry, drawing, collage, or silence. Supplies and light refreshments provided. You are welcome to bring your own materials if you choose.



Collage as Prayer - April 20 @ 10am

Sometimes when we struggle to find words for our hopes, fears, deepest anxieties, and greatest joys images can help us explore and break open our hidden hearts to God. After a brief guided meditation, participants will work on an 11 x 14 board (suitable for framing) illustrating their prayers. All supplies will be provided, but you may want to bring: any pretty paper scraps or ephemera, scissors if you have personal favorites, old photos (or photocopies of treasured personal photos).

One of the Bible's most familiar stories tells how Jesus's followers, frustrated by the crowds around him, lowered a paralyzed man through a hole in the roof to be healed by Jesus. With the deteriorating roof on the Chester Presbyterian Church Fellowship Hall, this story could have easily happened here! Perhaps this is somewhat of an exaggeration but the roof has been steadily deteriorating over the last 15 years and without immediate repair, damage is likely to occur throughout this wing of the church. This is the only roof on the CPC complex that is not galvanized and it is gradually deteriorating since its construction in 1994.

The Fellowship Hall houses a number of ministries of Chester Presbyterian Church from the church preschool, funeral receptions, fellowship outings, Fantabulous Fridays, movie nights, celebrations and Grace Cafe. It is also a potential source of revenue for rentals ranging from weddings, receptions, dance recitals and more.

Staring March 24, 2024 and running through June 2, 2024, the Rescue the Roof campaign will be asking your help to raise \$65,000 to repair the roof and complete a few minor projects. We ask everyone to prayerfully consider contributing to this project which is vital to the activities of the church. While cash or check offerings are always welcome, the church will gladly accept any other means of potential revenue such as vehicles or property.
